



Dear Madam.

In reply to your letter dated 20th ultimo, concerning 2nd Lieutenant C. T. Collier, 53rd (late 18th)
Battalion, who is reported wounded, I beg to state that particulars as to the nature of the wound, and the name of the hospital to which he was admitted, were not furnished in the cable message received from London. His case, however, is not reported as serious, and as no further information has since come through, it is assumed he has been making favourable progress towards recovery, the practice of the overseas authorities being to notify the Department of any unsatisfactory change in condition.






